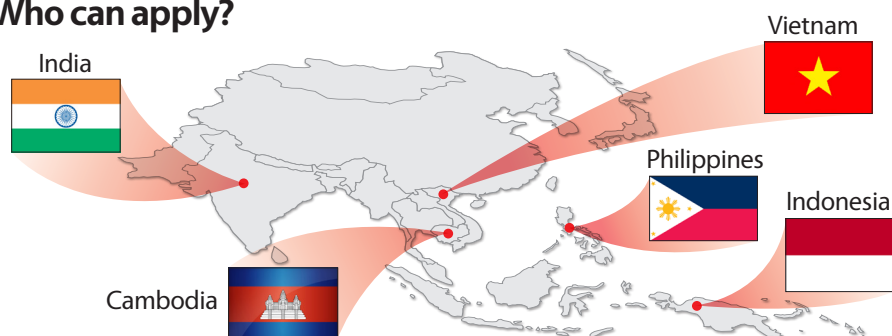

Eligibility

- Be a Vietnamese, Cambodian, Filipino, Indonesian or Indian citizen
- Have at least one undergraduate degree in business administration, journalism, communication, organizational development, marketing, international business or relevant fields.
- Have at least two years' of work experience after graduation by the time your application
- Have a valid minimum TOEFL iBT 79 or IELTS 6.5.

Required documents

Your complete online application package must include:

- Curriculum vitae
- Cover letter
- Academic transcript and degree
- English certification
- Work recommendation letter
- Passport
- A 500-word essay: *“Considering economic, environmental and social factors, how has international trade improved your daily life?”*

A successful candidate will be the one who is able to demonstrate a clear and detailed description of study objectives and show a clear connection between their studies and future trade-related career through a compelling cover letter. He or she will need to demonstrate academic excellence and strong English proficiency
